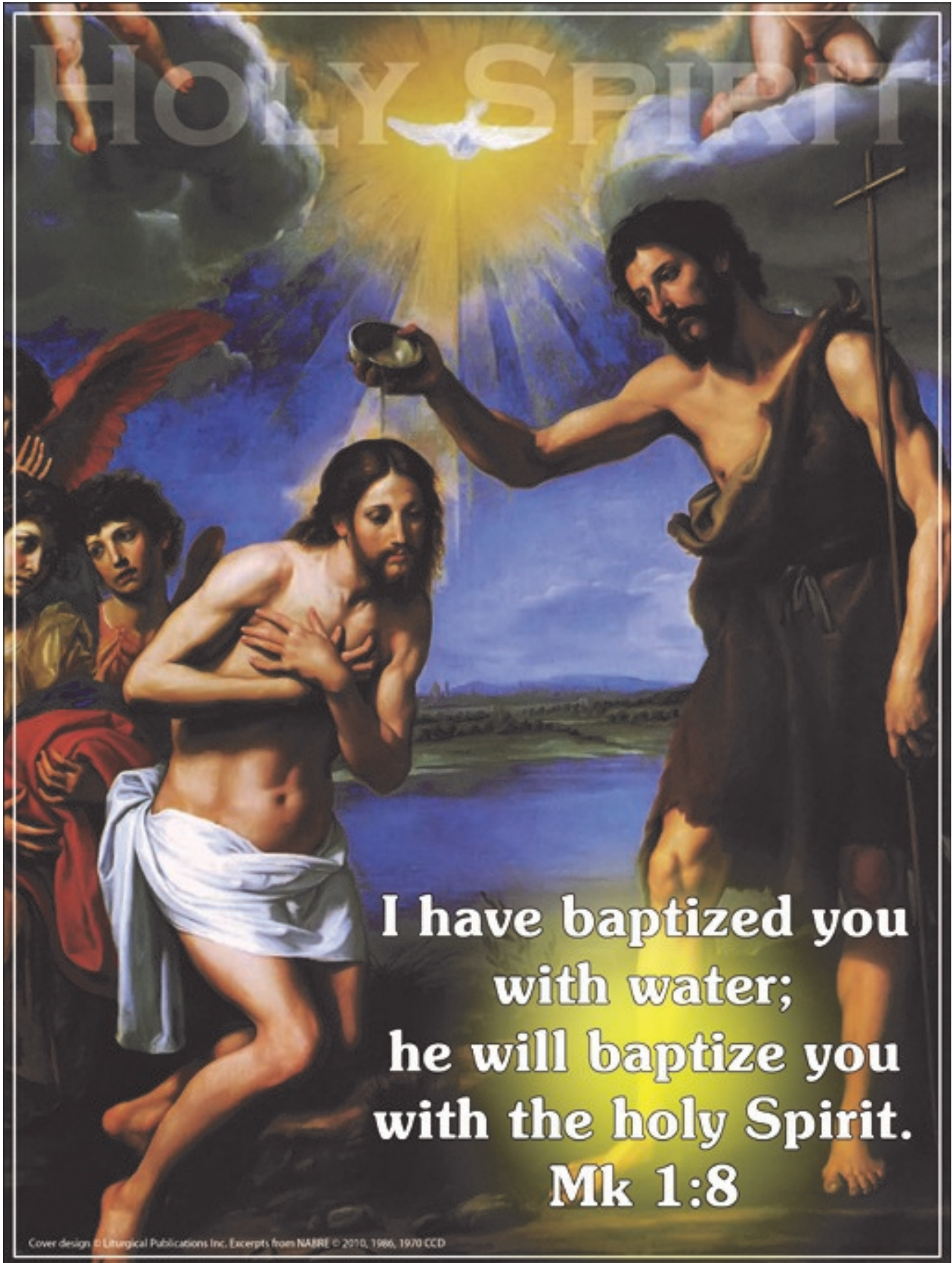

During February school vacation, nineteen Holy Spirit Parish high school students and adult chaperones will be traveling to Jamaica to serve at the mission of Holy Spirit Church in Maggotty. In this rural area of Jamaica, approximately a quarter of the adult population has an annual income of less than \$800 a year. The unemployment rate is in the area of seventy percent - a statistic that hasn't changed much for many years due to high levels of illiteracy and few economic opportunities.

Our mission team knows that they can't change these sobering realities, but they can help a few folks at a time, and can offer that assistance in the name of Jesus Christ. The trip will last a week. In the mornings the group will work on projects within the agriculture program, or break into smaller groups for painting, construction, and repair jobs on the property or within the community. Some of the team will help out at the Holy Spirit medical clinic, and others will be available to tutor adults in reading. In the afternoon, they will run a vacation Bible school for all of the children who attend the after-school program at the mission, and will also be available for tutoring and homework help.

Many of the families who attend Holy Spirit Church in Maggotty are not able to pay the \$600 per year in tuition, supplies and uniforms that is needed to send their children to school. The Holy Spirit Foundation Education Program was started in 2004 with help from our own parish's outreach committee, to help some of these children. The funding continues mostly from donations, and is supplemented by the proceeds of the Holy Spirit - Maggotty agriculture program. There are over two hundred children in the program, and many more on a wait list. New children cannot be accepted into the program until there is enough money in the fund to sponsor the child through the entire school year.

During Advent, several of our teens spoke at all of the parish Masses, while others visited each of our faith formation classes at both church sites to teach our parish children about what it means to be a missionary, and what this parish mission seeks to accomplish. The group was hoping to raise awareness about the trip among parishioners and to ask for prayers and support. The response from our parish has been amazing! Above and beyond the generous financial support of the parish outreach committee, thirty-nine parish families signed up to be prayer partners with the team, and parishioners provided cash donations of over \$2,400.00! Those donations will provide FOUR Maggotty children with the life-altering opportunity to attend school next year! Thank you!

### Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest

**Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest, is a rite provided by the Church as a response to the need of the faithful to gather for Sunday worship in the absence of a priest.** Assemblies of this kind should not diminish but rather increase the desire of the faithful to take part in the celebration of the Eucharist.

**Why does the Church gather on Sunday?** The apostles counseled people to gather on Sunday as members of Christ's body. St. Ignatius of Antioch observed that in the early Church the faithful held the Lord's Day in such high regard that they never willingly omitted its observance even in times of persecution.

The Second Vatican Council reiterated this teaching that the faithful must come together in observance of the Lord's Day. By hearing the Word of God and taking part in the Eucharist, the Paschal mystery, i.e. the passion, resurrection, and glorification of the Lord Jesus is remembered and thanksgiving is offered to God for a living hope through the resurrection of the Lord.

The assembly of the faithful manifests the Church as called by God to celebrate oneness in Christ. Together the faithful receive spiritual formation and instruction in the Paschal Mystery through the scriptures and homily. The celebration of the Eucharistic sacrifice expresses the one sacrifice by Jesus for the forgiveness of sins. Hence, the Lord's Day is the primary holy day and should be celebrated in as complete a way as possible. Other celebrations should not have precedence over the Sunday celebration of Mass.

**When does a parish celebrate this rite?** The Diocese recognized that in the exceptional case when a parish priest is absent due to sickness or some other emergency, and when another priest cannot take his place, a complete celebration of the Eucharist on the Lord's Day may not be possible. At this time no planned, or scheduled celebrations in the absence of a priest may be held.

How is this rite celebrated? The riches of Sacred Scripture and of the Church's prayer may be amply provided to the faithful in various ways apart from the Mass. Two options are provided for Sunday worship in the absence of a priest:

1. a celebration of Morning or Evening Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours;
2. a celebration of the Liturgy of the Word.

Both options may include the distribution of Holy Communion if there are a sufficient number of hosts in the tabernacle. Although our diocesan policy allows these celebrations to be held in an emergency we are reminded that these options should not be regarded as the ideal solution or as a surrender to mere convenience. There should normally be only one assembly of this kind in each place on any given Sunday.
