## *Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest ...continued*

### Who are the leaders of prayer for the rite?

Through ordination the deacon has responsibility of the leading the prayer of the assembly; therefore, preference is given to the appointment of deacons as leaders of prayer when the parish gathers for one of the Sunday Celebrations in the Absence of a Priest. Lay people who have been appointed, trained and commissioned have been given the responsibility of leading worship in the absence of a priest or deacon. A lay person leads the prayer of a community by virtue of the common priesthood that each Christian shares through baptism and confirmation. They should regard the office entrusted to them not so much as an honor, but as a responsibility, and above all, as a service to the parish under the authority of the pastor.

Leaders of prayer are persons who exhibit:

- ◆ A deep reverence for the Eucharist
- ◆ A living appreciation of Scripture
- ◆ A strong desire and ability to foster participation in worship
- ◆ A life consistent with the Gospel
- ◆ An active prayer life, and active involvement in the pastoral life of the community
- ◆ A spirit of cooperation with the members and pastoral leaders of their parish
- ◆ A willingness to be trained and receive continued instruction for this ministry.

**On February 8, the USCCB will observe the National Day of Prayer for Victims and Survivors of Human Trafficking.** February 8 is the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita, who was kidnapped as a child and sold into slavery. Once freed, she dedicated her life to sharing her testament of deliverance from slavery and comforting the poor and suffering.

Through prayer, we not only reflect on the experiences of those that have suffered through this affront to human dignity, but we also comfort, strengthen, and help empower survivors. In the words of our Holy Father Pope Francis, may we be "*slaves no more but brothers and sisters.*"

**My name is Madi, and I attend Wells High School. In one of our classes, we are learning about ISIS (Sunni Muslim Radical Terrorist Group) that aims to create an Islamic State in Iraq and Syria.** They are persecuting any religious followers that stand in the way of threat—Iraqi Christians being the most targeted. Hundreds of thousands have fled their homes.

Christians in Iraq and Syria are currently being given the option to convert to Islam, pay a tax, leave the country, or be put to death. I am trying to help raise awareness and help our brothers and sisters overseas.
