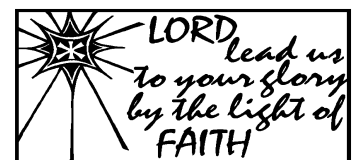

Since the time of Jewish freedom from slavery, Jews have celebrated this historic event by having a feast called the Seder. Seder (SAY-der) means order and refers to the order of historical events recalled in the Passover meal as well as the meal itself. While the main Passover story is read by Jews the world over from the Haggadah, local customs and traditions have changed over time so that the festival has been adapted to reflect the life of local communities.

You are invited to our adaptation of this ancient festival. Sign up in the narthex so that a place with all the traditional foods will be set for you. Please bring a covered main dish (no pork) or a dessert.

Fast & Abstinence

- ◆ Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—Are days of fast and abstinence (from meat) in the universal Church.
- ◆ Every Friday of Lent—All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (from meat) in the Church in the United States.
- ◆ The Law of Abstinence—Binds Catholic aged 14 and older.
- ◆ The Law of Fasting—Binds Catholics aged 18 and over, until the beginning of their 60th year (through age 59).

Lenten Environment & Music—During Lent, the decoration of the altar with flowers is not permitted; musical instruments may be played only to give necessary support to the singing. Exceptions to these rules include *Laetare* Sunday, Solemnities and Feasts.
