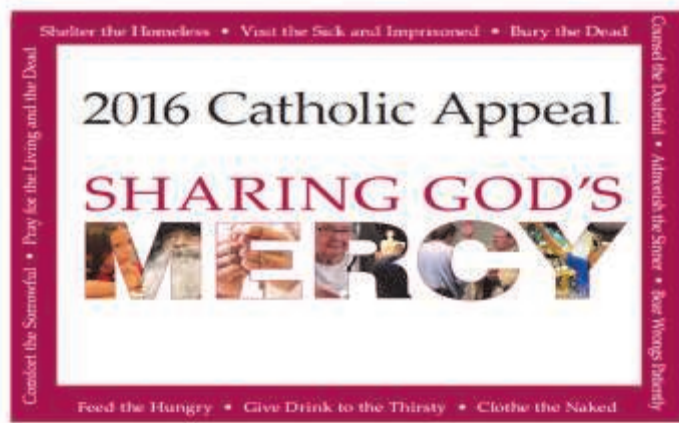

**St. Mary's Ecumenical Food Pantry**

Have you ever stopped by St. Mary's on a Thursday afternoon between 1 and 3:00? If you have, you will have noticed a lot of activity in the back hall near the office suite. That is where a group of dedicated volunteers gather to distribute food to our neighbors in need. Ellie Grover, Director, heads a team of people who operate a very well organized pantry serving typically 30 families comprising 100+ individuals each week.

The pantry was originally started as a soup kitchen about 1990 and has evolved into the pantry you see today. The pantry is a 501C3 non-profit organization under the auspices of the Diocese of Portland. Clients are vetted for participation by the town of Wells and arrive on Thursday afternoons ready to enjoy the food selections and friendly atmosphere.

Since floor space is limited, Ellie and her staff have developed a very efficient means of distribution. Each client is given a paper form allowing them to select items they need. A large section includes non-perishable items most usually available. There is a section offering refrigerated and frozen items and a last section including items which may be taken once a month. Perishable items such as produce and fresh bread are located in the hallway to be selected by the clients as they wait for their order to be filled. Due to a shortage of floor space, this works better than having clients select their own items.

Food is donated by local organizations as well as individuals. Restaurants, the Boy Scouts, local Police Departments, Postal Workers, and other businesses conduct food drives and donate the food to the pantry. Farmers and local gardeners donate produce in season. The Wells Super Food Market is an ongoing contributor and the Wells Hannaford in conjunction with Good Shepherd Food Bank is especially generous. A US Government program called TMAP also provides a great deal of food at no cost. People's Choice Credit Union and York County Credit Union donate significant funds each year. The pantry also purchases food from Good Shepherd and from local businesses. And, of course, parishioners are counted on to donate items as listed in the church bulletin each week.

The efficiency and network for accumulating food supplies is truly impressive. There are some long time volunteers who know some amazing sources. Ellie keeps track of the schedule of volunteers which numbers about 50 as well as the list of vetted clients. Volunteers typically give about eight hours of time each week with some giving much more.

At this time there is not a need for additional volunteers. So, you ask "how may I help"? Providing items listed in the church bulletin is one way. Please select non-perishable items in small to medium sizes so as to serve more clients. Drop off is by the entrance to the parish hall or at the office in back of the church. Additionally, please consider making a cash donation which allows the purchase at favorable prices of those items which may be in short supply. To do that, please see Diane O'Neil in the church office.

Finally please remember the volunteers and clients of the Food Pantry in your prayers. As we support these ministries, we become the hands of hope in our beautiful community. Thank you for your continued help!

**SPIRITUAL EXERCISES OF ST. IGNATIUS: 19<sup>TH</sup> ANNOTATION RETREAT**
