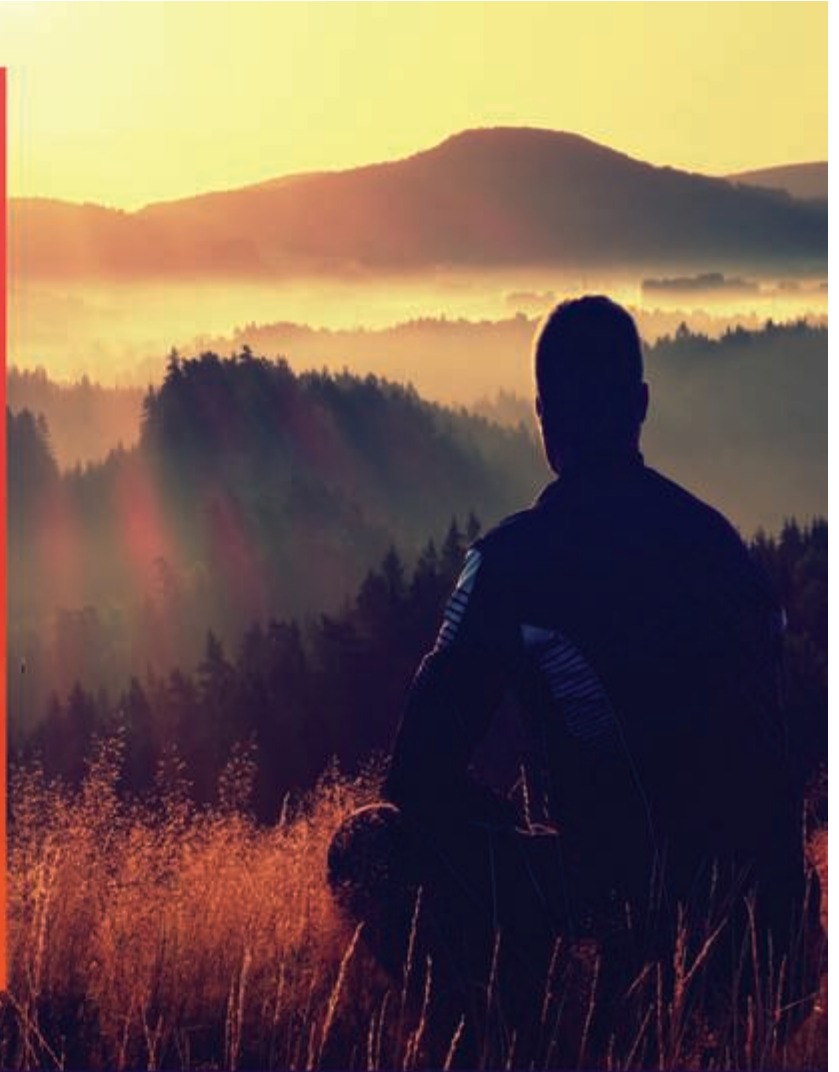

RESULTS OF MASS TIME CHANGE AT ST. MARTHA

The survey results for the 11 AM Mass returning to 10 AM on Sundays at St. Martha is as follows: In favor of the change to 10 AM: 443; In favor of leaving it at 11 AM: 69, Total votes cast: 512. Almost six and half times more people want it to change then did not. Please know that even before the survey, those staff and organizations within the Parish at St. Martha all agreed with the change to the earlier time.

Faith Formation Staff and volunteers all form the consensus that it would be fine and that they could work with it easily. Thanks you for your input. **The Sunday 11 AM Mass will move to 10 AM on the First Sunday of Advent on November 27, 2016, the weekend after Thanksgiving.**

Greetings from Midcoast Maine where I now live, only ten minutes north of L. L. Bean. Upon my arrival to All Saint Parish I found myself at the helm of a 4.7 million campaign to build a new multi-purpose event center including a gymnasium, an auditorium, adoration chapel and more. It will be housed next to the parish school at St. John's in Brunswick.

I want to thank Fr. Fred who on behalf of all of you made a \$5,000.00 donation to our campaign. The parishioners of All Saints are deeply grateful and inspired. I have explained to them the miraculous acts of kindness you as a tithing parish have been able to achieve over the years. Thank you, Thank you!

In addition to this the Knights of Columbus, both councils of Kennebunk and Wells and the Council of the Fourth Degree awarded us \$2,500.00 for "Express to Africa". We are speechless. When I arrived here I welcome Fr. Eugen, an African Priest from Cameroon. Fr. Eugen is one of three Priests serving the parish along with Fr. Lupo and myself. Also three dedicated retired Priests, your own Fr. Ford with Fr. Rice and Fr. Welch.

One day when sharing stories from Cameroon we all noticed a new building in Fr. Eugen's village. When we asked about it we discovered that it was a new hospital however empty of all things a hospital needs. Through a sudden mysterious and remarkable turn of events we have been able to fill two containers of hospital beds, chairs, tables, lamps and all extra hospital needs to ship to Cameroon. In the midst of all that is happening Wells & Kennebunk K of C gave \$2,500.00 to people they never met and without hesitation. I knew when I left in July I was leaving a wonderful, gracious and generous parish.
