



#### TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



#### 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." This is a fascinating promise. Jesus enlightens us today about the power of communal faith. He emphasizes that a gathering of like-minded believers, small though it may be, has a powerful effect. As he tells his disciples, "If two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father." Alright then, what are we waiting for? We should take Jesus up on this amazing offer! Going to Mass is one way to do so. When we gather together every Sunday, we do more

than listen to readings and receive the Eucharist. We also PRAY together. The priest leads us in these prayers, of course, but we are meant to join with him, as the Second Vatican Council put it, with "fully conscious, and active participation" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, #14). We are to make the prayers our own by attentively joining in with them from our hearts. Mindlessly reciting "Amen" or absently whispering the words of the Our Father likely loses the effect Jesus was talking about in today's Gospel. But truly praying together with our parish community certainly fits the bill. We need not be at church to fulfill this kind of prayer, however. It only takes two! Those of us who live with others can exercise communal prayer every day in our own homes, just by joining each other for a few moments of petition or praise. Those who live alone may need to reach out more deliberately, but it only takes a phone call to "gather together" with another believer and offer up our prayers. May we have the courage to invite others to join us as we bring our needs to God.

<u>We're almost there!!!</u> Many thanks to the wonderful volunteers who have come forward to serve as faith formation catechists and assistants!! We are **still in need** of assistants/co-catechists for kindergarten, 5<sup>th</sup>/6<sup>th</sup> grade, and Junior High school on Sunday mornings at St. Mary's, an assistant for 1<sup>st</sup> grade on Monday afternoons at St. Mary's, and an assistant for the kindergarten class on Sunday morning at St. Martha. We are always looking for people to



serve as "faith techs" to provide extra assistance to children with disabilities, and for folks to share the Sunday readings with children during the 9am Mass at St. Mary's and the 10am Mass at St. Martha. The faith formation office invites you to think and pray about whether you might be called by the Holy Spirit to assist with the faith formation of our parish children. Being a catechist, assistant or faith tech is a wonderful opportunity to give back to our faith community, and to share the love of Jesus with the next generation of Catholics. Classes begin on September 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>. Faith Formation for the 2017-2018 Academic Year Registration for youth faith formation (religious education) for the 2017-2018 academic year for Kindergarten through High School is ongoing. Youth classes begin on September 24<sup>th</sup> with Sunday morning sessions at both St. Martha & St. Mary for Kindergarten through High School, and a Monday afternoon session at St. Mary's for grades 1-6. Classes are provided for children of all abilities. Children with developmental, intellectual, sensory, physical or behavorial disabilities are welcome and encouraged to attend! Registrations are required for all children, regardless of whether they have participated in Faith Formation at Holy Spirit Parish previously. Sacramental preparation is a two-year process (typically in 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> grade) in the Diocese of Portland, so families are encouraged to enroll their pre-school and kindergarten-aged children in the programs at the parish in order that they may develop familiarity with faith formation prior to the Sacramental preparation years. Faith Formation Family Handbooks with Registrations Forms are available in the church offices, in the narthexes, and on our parish website at <a href="www.holyspiritme.org">www.holyspiritme.org</a>. The Handbook contains an academic calendar, a description of programs and policies, and other faith formation-related information. A Parish that Welcomes People with Disabilities The National Directory for Catechesis states that, "The whole community of faith needs to be aware of the presence of persons with special needs within it and be involved in their catechesis." (NDC, 49) Catholics believe that all people are made in the image and likeness of God, and that all the baptized share in the life and mission of the Church. This includes people from every range of ability. As a parish we are mindful and respectful of families who have children with disabilities. At times due to the behavorial aspects of some atypical conditions, parents of children with disabilities become nervous that their child may not be welcome during the celebration of Mass. As a faith community, let us strive to be patient, respectful and helpful to individuals with disabilities. Let us also find ways to support and assist their families to make it easier for them to worship together as a family. As brothers and sisters in Christ, each one of us has an essential place at the table, and we are all enriched and blessed by one another as we become one Eucharistic community of faith.
